

## Style Sheet

1. All submissions should be of current interest to AREA members and make a substantive contribution to the forensic vocational and economic research and practice literature.
2. Manuscripts must be double-spaced and typed on only one side of 8½ x 11 inch paper, using 1 inch margins, and 12-pt type.
3. An original and three copies of the manuscript must be submitted. Contributors are also urged to submit manuscripts and tables on IBM compatible diskettes in Windows versions of Word or Word Perfect, or via e-mail as an attachment. Email the document to [barrett@forensiceconomics.org](mailto:barrett@forensiceconomics.org). The program and version used should be designated on the diskette label or attachment.
4. In addition to the title of the article, the first page should include only the author's name, title, affiliation, complete mailing address, and telephone number. **This is the only place where the author's name, etc. should appear.** An abstract of no more than 150 words is also required.
5. Camera-ready artwork for figures and tables must be provided for papers accepted for publication. **Each table or figure should be on a separate page and numbered consecutively.** Headings and other textual material for tables and figures should be double-spaced with only the first letter of the word capitalized.
6. References should be cited within the text using the author-date system. The last name of the author followed by the year of publication should be enclosed in parentheses and usually placed at the end of the sentence before the punctuation, *i.e.*, (Smith 1981) or (Craig & Maiman 1984, Smith 1981).
7. Bibliographic entries should be listed alphabetically at the end of the paper under the heading "References." The following formats for journal, book, and legal citations, respectively, should be employed:

Brush, Brian C., and Charles H. Breeden. 1994. "Income Taxes and Economic Damages." *Journal of Legal Economics* 4: 51-63.

Deutsch, Paul M., and Horace W. Sawyer. 1985. *Guide To Rehabilitation*. New York: Matthew Bender.

*Jones & Laughlin Street Corp. v. Pfeifer*, 462 U.S. 523, 103 S. Ct. 2541, 76 L. Ed. 2<sup>nd</sup> 768 (1983).

(Note: Each entry must have a year of publication, and all journal references must include volume and page numbers.)

8. The use of endnotes or footnotes is discouraged. However, if information cannot be incorporated into the main text, endnotes should be numbered consecutively. Please do not use footnotes.
9. The use of first person should be avoided.
