Estimating Damages for Personal Injury and Wrongful Death: Knowing and Using the Right Tools

Goal: To prepare attendees for calculating lost earning capacity, lost economic support, lost household services and the present value of life care plans by discussing the fundamental techniques and resources needed for completing the analysis.

Objectives:

- 1. Provide a foundation of mathematical models and their use in calculating personal damages.
- 2. Inform attendees of sources available for assisting an expert (*e.g.*, worklife expectancy tables, personal consumption tables).
- Prepare attendees for being able to review data, to determine what approach is appropriate and to complete loss calculations while being able to explain how the work was performed.

This session is essential for anyone entering the field or considering starting to provide economic damages calculations in personal injury or wrongful death cases. It will also be a good primer for anyone wanting to sit for the CEA exam. The session will review the basic models for calculating lost earning capacity and lost economic support. The three methods for discounting to present value will be discussed and attendees will be shown how to make such calculations via Excel spreadsheets and Texas Instrument calculators. Resources needed for making such calculations will be reviewed. In the end, the attendees should leave with the tools to estimate damages calculations for personal injury and wrongful death situations and the ability to share with the trierof-fact the methods and data used in their analysis.

Quantifying the Impact of Life Care Plan Recommendations on Vocational Prognosis and Earnings

Sometimes a vocational analysis does not result in a reduction in earning capacity – sometimes it does. However, in either case, there is often additional pressures placed upon vocational functioning when an evaluee has ongoing healthcare needs. These pressures may lead to intermittent reduction in earnings, impingement upon access to paid time off, reduction in labor market access, or work life expectancy.

Loss of Household Services: A Methodology for Establishing Probable Worth

While this valuable topic is not at all new, it has the potential of being utilized significantly more, especially by Vocational Experts, as part of their forensic practice. The session is designed for both new and seasoned Experts who either already construct HHS evaluations or who rebut the evaluations done by others. At least one actual case study will be shared based upon a timeline methodology form that the presenter has developed and used in litigation. The methodology shows the use a myriad of existing references - to include an interview/research questionnaire, and data from ATUS (the American Time Use Survey) and the DVD ("The Dollar Value of a Day" from Expectancy Data). Attendees will be given an opportunity to construct parts, if not all, of an expert report of calculations using this methodology as applied to noted resources. Attendee participation is encouraged, and alternate methodologies used by others in the session will be shared for educative and comparative purposes. (Disclaimer: The methodology stops short of reducing to Present Value, which may be thereafter developed by an Economic Expert.)
