

Thomas was recently released from Harborview Medical Center in Seattle, where he has been since Father's Day after being flown from UCSD Hospital in April, and is now receiving full-time in-home care. Thomas is expected to require months of rehabilitation care, and John has been by his side through all phases of care since the accident. John has not been accepting any new work, and does not plan to until at least toward the end of this year.



TIPS FROM A PRO

This is a tip for writing effective rebuttal or response to rebuttal reports. I call this tip, "Never Slap Chris Rock." Remember the infamous incident at the 2022 Academy Awards when actor Will Smith slapped comedian Chris Rock? Initially, Rock didn't react to the attack; he acted professionally up there on stage. As damages experts, we may feel tempted to make claims about our expertise and

values; however, our values will either shine or fade when we are tested, as they are reflected in our actions.

In my early years with only 6 or 7 years of experience, for a short while I used to respond aggressively to other experts' rebuttals, when they were aggressive towards me. However, I quickly realized that this behavior was viewed by attorneys as being unprofessional and combative. Unfortunately, aggressiveness seems to be more prevalent in our field compared to other areas of expertise, such as engineering and medical fields, where such behavior is rare.

It's essential to differentiate between arguing a point and arguing with someone. Will Smith's action and Chris Rock's response serves as a warning that being aggressive towards another expert will only reflect poorly on you and your ability to handle criticism professionally. Please, stay the course people, and don't wallow in the mud with the pigs.

Arizona Supreme Court Chief Justice Robert Brutinel presented Mr. Sims with an outstanding service award for all of his work. Once again, congratulations!

When asked about the award, Mr. Sims said, "Well they did have a budget to pay me for this work, but I said I'd do it Pro Bono, so ... I guess they had to give me an award of some sort, LOL!" IN REMEMBRANCE

It is with true sadness that we announce the passing of one of AREA's contributors, Kurt V. Krueger, Ph.D. Dr. Krueger was a co-author of the following two articles in *The Earnings Analyst*, "A Review of Economic Foundations of Earnings and Discounting Theories Used in Forensic Economics," and "Tort Remedy in the Law versus Economic Restitution for Personal Injury and Wrongful Death." Dr. Krueger had been an active practicing forensic economist at John Ward Economics, and the central figure in publications that many of us rely on, such as *The Dollar Value of a Day* and *Healthy Life Expectancy*, by Expectancy Data. Dr. Krueger will be sorely missed.

IN MEMORY OF BILLY JOE McCROSKEY

Born April 13, 1945 - Died May 13, 2023 (age 78)



Dr. McCroskey came from a humble rural Georgia family. He distinguished himself in the military during a time when everyone had a Top Security Clearance, he had Crypto. It was there he discovered the ability to see patterns others did not see. This became a crucial skill in his Rehabilitation Counseling Ph.D. program when he saw unique patterns in the Dictionary of Occupational Titles (DOT). The physical demands and cognitive requirements for each job combined to produce a normal distribution where no two jobs had the same value. Using this marvelous model of the world of work became the basis for his degree and profession.

The Vocational Quotient (VQ) distribution scaled the DOT to predict occupational skills long before anyone thought about the Federal Rules of evidence. He published specific information so that all DOT programs could utilize the predictive power of the VQ with no limitations. The VQ was extremely effective in predicting low to medium incomes. Then he developed the Economic Quotient (EQ) that was a more direct predictor of higher incomes. Again, he published all the results so everyone could do the same.

His unique skill to see patterns extended to understanding the work of Vocational Experts. There was a research study of Rehabilitation Professionals using various DOT computer programs. Dr. McCroskey's program weighed some variables higher because he knew they were crucial in determining loss of earning capacity. As a result, the McCroskey Vocational Quotient System (MVQS) computer program was the best predictor of Vocational Experts' responses.

Vocational Experts have benefited from his wisdom. Unfortunately, the genetics that created his marvelous ability also carried the family traits of diabetes that ended his life prematurity. We are all grateful for what he created and saddened by the loss of glorious things he would have done if he had lived longer. We salute Billy Joe McCroskey, Ph.D.

CASE LAW OF INTEREST TO FORENSIC ECONOMISTS AND VOCATIONAL EXPERTS

In case you haven't heard yet, Dr. Thomas Ireland, Professor Emeritus of Economics at the University of Missouri-St. Louis, has graciously been keeping a webpage with a collection of published court cases that are of interest to all of our professions. His website is located at http://www.umsl.edu/~irelandt/index.html.

Scroll down to the link titled "Masterlist of Legal Decisions Since January 1, 2010." The following few cases are presented here in this newsletter. Some of the citations contain a further explanation by Dr. Ireland himself. There are many more cases listed in this link and on Dr. Ireland's website, and you are encouraged to search through it.



James v. Antarctic Mech. Servs, 2020 U.S. Dist. LEXIS 52619 (S.D. MS 2020). Economic expert Dr. George Carter relied upon earnings projections of vocational expert Kathy Smith, who did not rely on James's actual earnings record. The Court stated that loss of earning capacity in Mississippi must be based at least in part on a plaintiff's actual earnings record, if such a record existed. For that reason and because lost fringe benefit can only be calculated if there is evidence that a plaintiff is actually using them, Smith's testimony was excluded and Carter's testimony that relied upon Smith's opinions on lost earning capacity was also excluded. Carter was permitted to testify about household services based on Carter's assumption that James's custodial granddaughter would continue to live with James until age 18.

Miller v. Juarez Cartel, 2022 U.S. Dist. LEXIS 112463 (D. N.D. 6-24-2022). This was a judicial ruling by Federal Magistrate Judge Clare R. Hochhalter in an ATA (Anti-Terrorism Act) case involving deaths and injuries to two American families by the Juarez Cartel. The defendant was not represented and there was no expectation that the defendant would pay awarded damages. The case was bench-tried and expert reports were submitted in writing. Damage opinions of economic expert Stan V. Smith for one group of plaintiffs and by J. Matthew Sims for another group of plaintiffs were reported in the decision. Smith's opinions included loss of wages and benefits, loss of household services, loss of guidance and counsel, loss of accompaniment services, life care services of one decedent for a family member, value of life of decedents, or loss of society and relationship. Sim's damage opinions included loss of wages and benefits, household services and care for fellow family members, and cost of vocational rehabilitation for injured minor children. Sims did not include guidance and counsel, loss of accompaniment services, value of life, or loss of relationship, but Judge Hochhalter included amounts based on Smith's calculations for the first group of plaintiffs.
